You will receive a 20% discount on a season ticket purchase. Subject to availability, student tickets for all concerts can be purchased 30 minutes prior to a performance for \$10 with a valid student ID and proof of age under 25. Tickets also are available through the Student/ Teacher/ Parent Complimentary Ticket Program. If a concert is not sold out a week before the performance date, up to four complimentary tickets are available for a music student, the teacher and parents. Anne-Sophie Mutter is one of the greatest violinists of modern times. For more than 40 years, the four-time Grammy winner has been a fixture as a soloist in all of the world's most important concert halls. Born in then-West Germany in 1963, Ms Mutter at age six won first prize in violin in a national competition for young musicians. Conductor Herbert von Karajan, became an early mentor, and in 1977 at age 13, she made her professional debut with von Karajan and the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra. Since then, she has thrilled audiences throughout Europe, Asia and North and South America. Ms Mutter will be accompanied by pianist Lambert Orkis, one of the most respected American pianists in the fields of chamber and modern music.



Julie Coucheron is an award-winning pianist who tours internationally. Pianist Elizabeth Pridgen is a distinguished soloist and chamber musician and artistic director of the Atlanta Chamber Players. Under the direction of Susan Dodge, dancers from the Amelia Island Dance Festival will be performing. Susan Dodge is a noted choreographer and professional dancer. Formerly a member of the Paul Taylor Dance Company, she has taught at universities and conservatories across the nation.





Ricky Skaggs

Born and raised in Cordell, Kentucky, the bluegrass and country music giant played mandolin on stage with bluegrass pioneer Bill Monroe at seven and appeared on television with Lester Flatt & Earl Scruggs at seven. Ricky entered the world of professional music in 1971, and as his popularity soared, he garnered eight awards from the Country Music Association and several Grammys in the 1980s. He established his own record label in 1997, and since then, he and his bluegrass band Kentucky Thunder have released 12 consecutive Grammy-nominated albums, eight of which have won the award. In 2018, Ricky was inducted into the National Fiddler Hall of Fame, the International Bluegrass Music's Hall of Fame and the Country Music Hall of Fame.

Our Quartet-in-Residence, the Dover catapulted to international stardom following a stunning sweep of the 2013 Banff Competition. The first-ever quartet-in-residence of the Kennedy Center and recipient of the coveted Avery Fisher Career Grant, the Dover has become one of the most in-demand ensembles in the world. The quartet's distinctive sound has helped confirm its status as "the young American string quartet of the moment" (New Yorker). The Dover is quartet-in-residence for the Bienen School of Music at Northwestern University, Chamber Music Northwest, Artosphere and Peoples' Symphony in New York. The ensemble will make over 100 North American appearances during the current season. For the Dvorak sextet, the Dover will be joined by cellists Roberto Diaz-president and CEO of the Curtis Institute of Music and former principal cellist of the Philadelphia Orchestra—and Christopher Rex, the Festival's artistic and general director.

Violinist David Coucheron joined the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra as Concertmaster in 2010. He has soloed with many leading orchestras and given solo recitals at Carnegie Hall, Wigmore Hall and the Kennedy Center. Artistic Director of the Kon Tiki Chamber Music Festival in his hometown of Oslo, Norway, he is on the artist faculty of the Aspen Music Festival and Brevard Music Festival. Cellist Christopher Rex is the founder and artistic and general director of the Amelia Island Chamber Music Festival. He retired as principal cellist of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra in 2018 after serving in that position for 39 years. Pianist Julie Coucheron has established an international career, winning major awards in Italy, Germany, the U.K. and U.S. She has worked with Emanuel Ax, Yo-Yo Ma, and Elton John and has toured around the globe.

Ms. Frank also makes frequent appearances with the Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields, Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center and Musicians from Marlboro. Pianist Peter Serkin is admired equally for his performance of established repertoire and as a consummate interpreter of contemporary music. He has performed with many of the world's major symphony orchestras, and in chamber music, he has collaborated with Alexander Schneider, Yo-Yo Ma, and the Budapest, Guarneri, Orion, Shanghai and Dover quartets.




Itzhak Perlman

Violinist Itzhak Perlman enjoys superstar status rarely afforded a classical musician. Born in Israel in 1945, he came to New York as a young man and was propelled into the international arena with an appearance on the Ed Sullivan Show in 1958. Since winning the prestigious Leventritt Competition in 1964, Mr. Perlman has appeared with every major orchestra and in recitals and festivals around the world. He also is a frequent presence on the conductor's podium with major orchestras in the U.S. and Europe. Recipient of 15 Grammy Awards, Mr. Perlman was honored in 2008 with a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award for excellence in the recording arts. Mr. Perlman will be accompanied by acclaimed pianist Rohan de Silva, who also partners with such luminaries as Pinchas Zukerman, Midori, Joshua Bell and Gil

Shaham.

Born in Kiev, Ukraine, she began playing piano at the age of three, gave her first solo recital a year later and studied at the Kiev Conservatory. With a celebrated career spanning five decades, Pinchas Zukerman reigns as one of today's most sought-after and versatile musicians as a violin and viola soloist, conductor and chamber musician. Mr. Zukerman, along with cellist Amanda Forsyth and pianist Angela Cheng, began offering trio repertoire in 2011. Invitations from major festivals and venues led to the launch of the Zukerman Trio two years later. Since then, the trip has traveled around the globe and performed at such major festivals as Ravinia, the BBC Proms, Edinburgh, Verbier, and Bravo! Vail.

The Beth Newdome Fellowship Artists, composed of promising students from the nation's leading conservatories, will be mentored by professional musicians, culminating in a series of public performances, most of which will be free.
- The acclaimed Dover Quartet, our quartet-in-residence, conducts a free master class each season for young artists from Jacksonvillearea schools and universities
- We have joined with the Boys & Girls Clubs of Nassau County in holding a five-day-a-week Strings Education Program. Instruments are provided and there is no cost to the students.






