## ABOUT TODAY'S PERFORMANCE

---

Edvard Grieg's most popular work, the Legend of Peer Gynt was composed for Henrik Ibsen's Norwegian allegorical play in 1875. Today it is considered to be one of the finest examples of beautiful melodic 'picture painting.' Children of all ages will especially enjoy two of the best-known movements: "Morning" and "In the Hall of the Mountain King" as dancers from Susan Dodge's Amelia Island Dance Festival and an artist from Lauren Templeton's Amelia Art Studio interpret the music, live on stage.

Pianist and Director Julie Coucheron, in her native costume, narrates the story while a trio of musicians including Ms. Coucheron, Elizabeth Pridgen, piano, and violinist David Coucheron provide the musical inspiration for the dancers and the painter.

This production was originally conceived by the late Christopher Rex, founder and artistic director of the Amelia Island Chamber Music Festival, as a visual, musical and dance interpretation of the famous composition. Under the direction of Ms. Coucheron, the production is a collaborative effort with Lauren Templeton, founder of the Amelia Art Studio and Susan Dodge, director and founder of the Amelia Island Dance Festival. It is sponsored by the Young Patrons of the Amelia Island Chamber Music Festival.

Past chair of the Young Patrons, Ms. Templeton has recently handed the "baton" to Carrie Anderson Mays, a member of the group and founder/director of the Amelia Music Studio.

## Edvard Grieg

(1843–1907)

Edvard was one of the definitive leaders of Scandinavian music and his influence was great. Although composing many short piano pieces and chamber works, the work Grieg did for Henrik Ibsen stood out. Originally composing 90 minutes of orchestral music for the play, he later went back and extracted certain sections for the suites. Several different instruments are used to describe Peer Gynt's travels around the world to distant lands.

When Ibsen asked Grieg to write music for the play in 1874, he reluctantly agreed. However, it was much more difficult for Grieg than he imagined. "Peer Gynt progresses slowly," he wrote to a friend in August 1874, "and there is no possibility of having it finished by autumn. It is a very complex subject."



## Henrik Johan Ibsen

(1828 - 1906)

Henrik was a Norwegian playwright and theatre director. As one of the founders of modernism in theatre, Ibsen is often referred to as "the father of realism" and one of the most influential playwrights of his time.

Ibsen's early poetic and cinematic play Peer Gynt has strong surreal elements. After Peer Gynt Ibsen abandoned verse and wrote in realistic prose.

Ibsen is often ranked as one of the most distinguished playwrights in the European tradition, and is widely regarded as the foremost playwright of the nineteenth century. He influenced many other playwrights and novelists.

## ABOUT THE PERFORMERS

---

### Julie Coucheron



Pianist Julie Coucheron, who started playing the piano at age four, has established an international career winning prizes in Italy, Germany and the U.S. She has worked with such musicians as Lazar Berman, Claude Frank, Emanuel Ax, Vladimir Feltsman, John O’ Connor and Chistopher O’Riley. Ms. Coucheron has toured Europe, the U.S., South America and Asia, playing in many great halls, including Verizon Hall, Wigmore Hall, the Kennedy Center and Carnegie Hall.

Ms. Coucheron has performed at the Oslo Chamber Music Festival, Bergen International Music Festival and at La Jolla Summer Fest. She is artistic director for the Fjord Cadenza Festival in Norway and a founding member of the Kon Tiki Classical music Fest in Oslo, Norway.

Ms. Coucheron has released two recordings with her brother, violinist David, who is concertmaster of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. She is also an Artist-in-Residence in Piano at Kennesaw State University School of Music.

### Elizabeth Pridgen



Pianist Elizabeth Pridgen is a distinguished soloist and chamber musician, who has performed in concerts at Carnegie Hall’s Zankel Hall, Merkin Hall, the Tilles Center on Long Island, Spivey Hall in Atlanta, and the “Rising Stars Series” at the Ravinia Festival. Ms. Pridgen has also performed at Alice Tully Hall, Carnegie Hall’s Weill Recital Hall, and the Kosciuszko Foundation, and in recitals in London, Amsterdam, Rotterdam, Washington D.C., Miami, San Francisco, and throughout the Southeast and Caribbean.

In 2014 she was appointed Artistic Director of the Atlanta Chamber Players, one of the leading chamber ensembles in the United States. Ms. Pridgen performs regularly at festivals, including the Rome Chamber Music Festival in Rome, Italy, the Strings Music Festival in Steamboat Springs, Colorado, the Amelia Island Chamber Music Festival and the Aspen Music Festival. An avid chamber musician, she has collaborated with artists such as Elmar Oliveira, Robert McDuffie, Yo-Yo Ma, Lynn Harrell, Hilary Hahn, Sarah Chang and Anne Akiko Meyers.

### David Coucheron



Violinist David Coucheron joined the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra as Concertmaster in September 2010. At the time, he was the youngest concertmaster among any major U.S. orchestra.

An active recording artist, recordings with sister and pianist Julie Coucheron include “David and Julie” (Naxos/Mudi) and “Debut” (Naxos). He is also the featured soloist on the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra’s recording of Vaughan Williams’ *The Lark Ascending*, which was released on ASO Media in Fall 2014.

Coucheron began playing the violin at age three. He earned his Bachelor of Music degree from The Curtis Institute of Music, his Master of Music from The Juilliard School and his Master of Musical Performance from the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, studying with teachers including Igor Ozim, Aaron Rosand, Lewis Kaplan and David Takeno. Coucheron plays a 1725 Stradivarius, on kind loan from Anders Sveaas Charitable Trust.

### Susan Dodge



A professional dance artist and instructor, Susan Dodge is the founder and president of the Amelia Island Dance Festival. She is a former native of Jacksonville and a graduate of the Douglas Anderson School of the Arts. Susan is also a Summa Cum Laude graduate in Dance Performance from Southern Methodist University. She has taught at multiple dance universities and dance companies across the U.S. including New York's Paul Taylor School and was a co-founder of the Dance Project of Washington Heights. She has danced in many musicals and was a member of the Paul Taylor Dance Company and Taylor 2 in New York.

In addition to presenting the Amelia Island Dance Festival each year since 2019, Susan currently teaches at the Royal Amelia Dance Academy and is member of the board of the Florida Ballet of Jacksonville.



### Andrea Jones

Andrea Jones earned a bachelor's degree in studio art at the University of Denver. She has experience volunteering in art activities such as face painting and portrait drawing. Working with children of all ages in a creative setting inspires her own personal work. Andrea is the assistant at the Amelia Arts Studio and is the Visual Arts Specialist at The Amelia Island Montessori School.

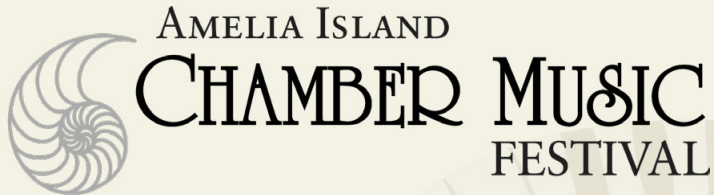
